Direct Instruction: What the Research Says

Direct Instruction was found to be one of the most effective teaching strategies Four meta-analyses that included DI were examined Across 304 studies, 597 effects, and over 42,000 students, he found an average effect size of 0.59 with similar positive results (0.99) for both

Five Meanings of Direct Instruction

This problem occurs because direct instruction, and terms such as direct teaching and explicit instruction, has both a general meaning and a specific meaning. The general meaning refers to any instruction that is led by the teacher regardless of quality. However, as will be discussed, the term direct instruction also has three specific uses: (a)
