"The Drummer Boy of Shiloh" by Ray Bradbury Literary Analysis: Comparing Characters of Different Eras A character is a person who takes part in the action of a literary work A dynamic character develops and learns because of events in the story A static character does not change Static characters are often used by writers to develop conflict
